Note that since averages are used, if a parent or teacher indicates that some of the questions are not applicable or left blank, you can leave those out of calculating the mean.

Swanson, Nolan, and Pelham (SNAP) Questionnaire - IV

The SNAP-IV consists of questions that evaluate symptoms of inattention, hyperactivity, and impulsivity. It can be used for children 6-18 years old. The mean responses are reported and compared to cutoffs, with separate cutoffs for inattention and hyperactivity.

The cutoffs below are considered clinically significant (based on 95th percentile).
